

OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH, SAFETY AND ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY STATEMENT

Tyne Pressure Testing (TPT) are fully committed to providing all employees with safe and healthy working conditions for the prevention of work related injury, ill health and to promote well-being. Furthermore, Tyne Pressure Testing recognises it has legal and moral responsibilities in preventing pollution and protecting the environment and is therefore committed to utilising resources in a sustainable manner, whilst minimising the impact on the environment from its business activities.

Everyone within Tyne Pressure Testing has a legal and moral obligation to stop work that is potentially unsafe, and are actively encouraged to do so by senior management. Tyne Pressure Testing's high-level objectives are zero accidents, zero harm to people and zero harm to the environment and to promote well-being.

In order to achieve these objectives, Tyne Pressure Testing has created seven key occupational health, safety and environmental (OHS&E) commitments, which are to:

1. Demonstrate that senior management takes overall responsibility and accountability for the prevention of work related injury and ill health as well as the provision of a safe and healthy workplace and activities.
2. Commit to the consultation and participation of workers, and, where they exist, workers' representatives on matters of OHS&E.
3. Provide a clearly defined framework for setting our OHS&E objectives.
4. Implement effective safe systems of work to ensure that operational control is in place for any tasks that may affect OHS&E performance including the provision of appropriate training, instruction, supervision and information to enable employees to perform their duties in a safe manner.
5. Drive to continually improve the OHS&E management system to enhance performance.
6. Eliminate hazards and reduce OHS&E risks by carrying out suitable and sufficient assessments.
7. Commit to fulfilling our legal requirements, other requirements and compliance obligations.

The ultimate responsibility for health, safety and the environment resides with the Tyne Pressure Testing Chief Executive Officer (CEO). Overall day-to-day management system control resides with the British Engines Head of Health Safety and Environment (HS&E), assisted by Individual Company Operational Management / Supervision and Individual Companies HS&E Advisors / Managers.
